
INTRODUCING

Dash's best friends are Latino twin boys who have two adoptive dads (who are Mexican and Italian, respectively) and a Black toddler sister. As two women, we've also tried to make sure Dash has strong male role models. In addition to his grandpas and uncles, his godfather ("Nino") is a steady presence in his life. He's an affectionate and gregarious Latino man who has taught Dash to swim and ride a bike, and he is one of our closest friends.

WHY **ADOPTION?**

Adoption runs through our family tree: C.C.'s mom was adopted, and Cheryl has cousins who were adopted. We are building a network of friends with adopted children Dash's age. Before we even met, we both read *The Kid*, Dan Savage's memoir about adopting his son through open adoption. It made perfect sense to us and served as a foundation for our conversations about growing our own family.

Our promises:

- >> We promise to love our child unconditionally, recognizing that they will always be both your child and our child, in different but equally meaningful ways.
- >> We promise to work with you to create a contact plan that feels right to you, and to honor the terms we all agree to (and to make updates together over time as needed).
- \rightarrow We promise to speak openly, honestly, and lovingly with our child about their birth family and about adoption.
- >>> We promise to continue educating ourselves about our child's birth culture, and to recognize that their experience as an adoptee is different from our own. We will approach new traditions and experiences with a sense of humility, respect, and curiosity.
- >> We promise to listen to our child's needs and do our very best to meet them.
